SEXISM AND FEMINISM IN TEXT ON STORY-BASED GAME "TEARS OF THEMIS": FEMINIST STYLISTIC

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ABSTRAK

Di dunia saat ini, bermain video game online sangat populer, terutama dengan Generasi Z. Feminisme adalah salah satu dari banyak topik yang termasuk dalam permainan online. Tears of Themis adalah salah satu contoh permainan yang menampilkan ide-ide feminis melalui representasi karakter, plot, mekanika permainan, dan interaksi sosial. Stilistik feminis menganalisis tulisan-tulisan di berbagai genre untuk mengungkapkan prasangka implisit dan representasi gender dalam bahasa. ABSTRACT

In today's world, playing video games online is very popular, especially with Generation Z. Feminism is one of the many subjects that are included in online games. 'Tears of Themis' is one example of a game that shows feminist ideas through character portrayal, storyline, game mechanics, and social interactions. Feminist stylistics analyzes writings across a wide range of genres to uncover implicit prejudices and gendered representations in language. This makes it possible to analyze the game's characters in light of the sexist language that is being displayed. The purpose of this study is to look into the ways in which a male character regularly engages in sexist behavior through textual encounters. The writers employed qualitative method, which is the approach being used. The results showed that feminist stylistics can be used to explore the idea of a problem related to gender values and equality in society even in this age.

INTRODUCTION

Online gaming is a prevailing trend in contemporary society, particularly among Generation Z. Accessed via the internet, online games facilitate both individual and group gameplay experiences. Additionally, they provide a communicative space accessible to players globally, contributing to the exponential growth in their popularity. According to Young (2020), online gaming denotes a network-connected form of play facilitated through the internet, wherein individuals interact to achieve objectives, fulfill missions, and attain high scores within a virtual environment (Drajat, 2017). Online games also encompass various themes, one of which is feminism. Such games present feminist values through character portrayal, plotline and narrative, game mechanics, and social interactions within the game.

Stylistics as one of the branches of linguistics can be interpreted simply as the study of how texts are styled in literary works, but not simply to describe its formal features for their own sake, but to show their functional importance in the interpretation of the text, or to highlight their literary effects in the linguistic arena (Katie, 1989). The main definitions of stylistics display researchers such as Crystal (2008:4) who see it as a "branch of linguistics which features situational distinctive uses (varieties) of language that are made by individuals and social groups in the use of their language". Thus, it can be concluded that stylistics focuses on the style of language use. The stylistic analysis also provides the reader with a scientific and objective commentary on the linguistic features of a literary as well as nonliterary text based on concrete and quantifiable data processed in a systematic way.

METHODOLOGY

In this study, the authors use qualitative methods. The author does a direct research by playing games that are the subject of reThe information was extracted straight from the game, and earlier studies were also carried out to provide a further examination of sexism and feminist style in general. Data collection is done by analyzing and recording some narratives or dialogues that show sexism in the story as well as feminist applications to the main female characters. Previous research was taken by the author through several official websites for national and international journals. After collecting data from both previous games and research, the authors analyzed the writing through previous data collected, namely the evidence of the narrative or dialogue in the game. The theory was only applied to one chapter of the plot because the game in question has a pretty long story. This allows the writer to conduct study and use well-suited theory when writing the article.

RESULT AND DISCUSSION

Tears of Themis is a game with an interactive story-based system developed by miHoYo and released globally by Cognosphere in July 2020. The main story in Tears of Themis is set in 2030, and takes place in a fictional town called Stellis. In the game, players will take on the role of a 24 year-old defense lawyer at Themis Legal Office with the code name "Rosa", and will protect her clients from cases that occur. Not only that, players will also look for answers to the mysteries behind cases that refer to the illegal distribution of a dangerous drug named NXX with the help of three suitors.

Even though it has a romantic theme like story-based games in general, Romance in this game is not really emphasized as the main theme. The detective adventure theme dominates the entire game, and the romance that occurs is only an insert that becomes a side-quest for the players. In this way, this game indirectly opens up more space for the ideas of independence and intelligence reflected by the main female character. Rosa, who worked hard to become a successful lawyer like her senior, Artem Wings, has opened up the idea of feminism in her game. If most story-based games focus on the romance between the main

female character and the male characters, This game focuses more on Rosa and the goals she wants to achieve with the mysteries she tries to solve. The presence of male characters is a form of support for the main female character, who is still developing herself throughout the story. However, several issues regarding gender inequality and sexism are also brought into the main story and become cases that must be solved by the players. The dialogues and narratives that occur in the game tell what problems occur in the story. Where these dialogues and narratives are the material for analysis and research into the reflection of sexism and feminism which will be discussed in this research.

Result

After analyzing one of the story chapters from Tears of Themis, the dialogue texts and narratives that reflect sexism and feminism are summarized in the following table:

Discussion

From what has been referenced in the introduction section, and seeing how a result can be obtained through a theory, It can be said that in literature elements and roles between genders cannot be separated. In relation to language, the areas of gender, equality and justice are never separated. A literary work has the author's point of view, culture, and even the thoughts of the characters involved. Differences between viewpoints or language patterns between male and female authors are not a problem. In fact, that is what can enrich the discussion in the work. However, it is the gap between rights and the role of gender played in the work that is often questioned.

Routledge (2014), Mills (1995) defines feminist stylistics as a different 'style of analysis,' mentioning that the terms 'feminist' and 'stylistics' have varied meanings for readers. The term represents her main focus on explicitly feminist analysis that employs linguistic analysis to investigate texts. This method goes beyond simply recognizing sexism in texts; it investigates how components such as point of view, agency, metaphor, or transitivity are inseparably connected to gender concerns, as well as whether women's writing practices may be classified (Mills 1995, p.1). Furthermore, Mills (2006, p. 221) claims that feminist stylistics is concerned with unraveling the complex messages inferred from texts and analyzing how readers interpret or resist these messages, rather than assuming that gender concepts revolve solely around discriminatory messages about sex differences. From this explanation, feminist stylistics aims to analyze how text producers use linguistic features that

portray male or female values, as well as how readers (including advertising, cinema, and radio audiences) identify gendered meanings in texts, either intentionally or unintentionally.

In the story plot that we took from the game Tears of Themis, it proves that feminist values move freely through the main character and the role he plays, considering that the main character is not depicted as a weak woman and does not act quickly. However, the difference between how other female characters are portrayed and how male characters are portrayed still reflects sexism in the story. Even from this chapter alone, it can be seen that more female characters are used as victims of men's bad actions. Even though in other story chapters that are not discussed in this research, there are several men who are victims, but the dominance of men as more powerful figures still exists. And the views that players or readers of the story will get will also be interpreted in different ways. In comparison with research that has been conducted previously on sexism, feminist views, and feminist stylistics, It can be said that a literary work can be a medium that conveys such concerns about gender. Even though this literary story is presented in a game that actually has a feminist nuance.

CONCLUSION

From the results that the researchers found in this study, it can be concluded that Feminist stylistics is a way to explore a person's understanding and point of view from the writing style and language patterns presented in the work. Feminist stylistics as a theory has been able to reveal a complex message to be conveyed through the gaps experienced by the story characters involved and differences in thoughts. A male character could be described as a coward, could be a strong person, could be a bad person, and the same goes for female characters. However, this label, although it will differ depending on the view of the viewer of his work, cannot be something that is truly attached to a particular gender. Women will not always be weak and become victims of men. And men are not always depicted as remaining in power and not running away if they encounter an evil witch. The gender equality that one want to achieve is a value that one want to emphasize. And feminist stylistics is one method that can explore all of that in literary works.

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
